# Traffic maze to stay in Ferndale

Northwest Ferndale's controversial network of right turn bans, one-way streets and road barricades will remain in effect for at least another couple of months.

That's what the City Council decided Monday night after

three-hour public hearing attended by a standing-room-only crowd.

Many residents criticized the traffic measures which were adopted on Aug. 25 for a 90-day trial period.

Janet Long of Oakridge Street said they were making her "dizzy."

But some residents described them as a necessary evil.

"They are a deterrent, not a convenience," said John Gysin of West Drayton.

Chuck Page, a West Oakridge resident, said, "I need to go four blocks south to go north. But if it means keeping 4,000 cars out ..."

Added Police Captain Joseph Sullivan, "It's a bitter pill. Residents should understand it does have a positive effect."

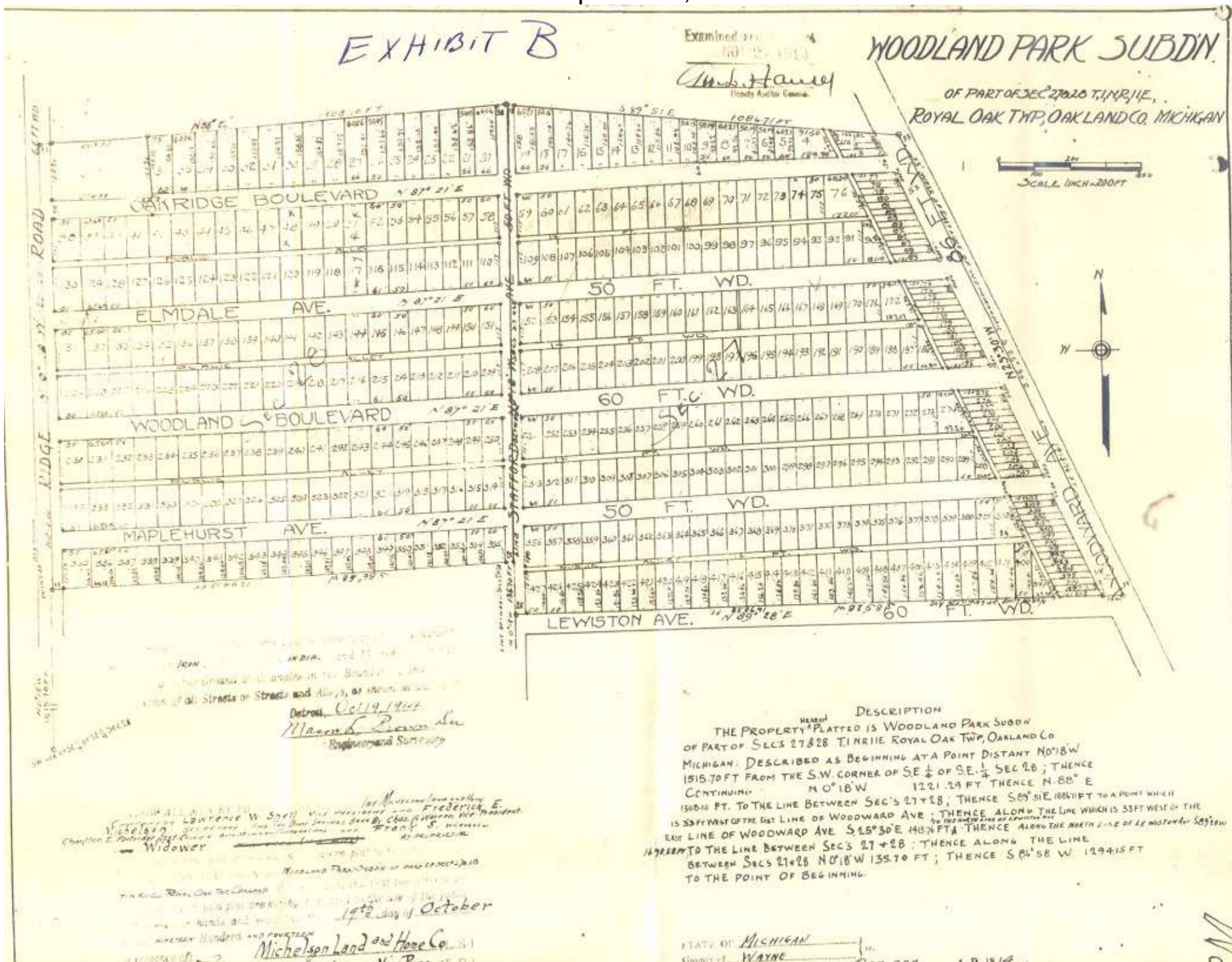
The measures were taken to deal with a recent overflow of side-street traffic caused by I-696 construction along Ten-Mile.

West Woodland and West Oakridge were made westbound one-way, several no right turn signs were erected and barricades were installed on Drayton and Maplehurst at Livernois.

Several Ferndale residents and city officials say the real culprit is a wall at Ten-Mile blocking off Pleasant Ridge's Ridge Road, which becomes Pinecrest in Ferndale. They say the state highway department erected the wall at the request of Pleasant Ridge.

Councilman Donald Saunders had harsh words for Pleasant Ridge.

"We wouldn't be here (for so long) if Pleasant Ridge didn't put up a wall. Pleasant Ridge has never cooperated with Ferndale," he said. "They did everything they could to get that wall up there."

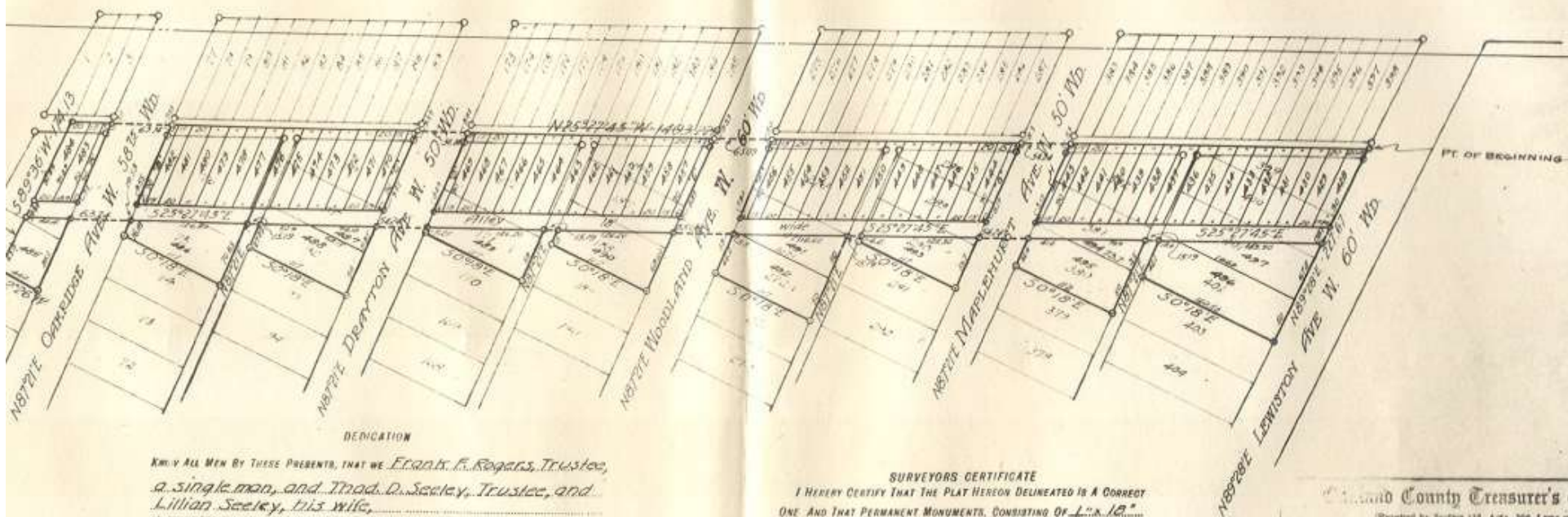

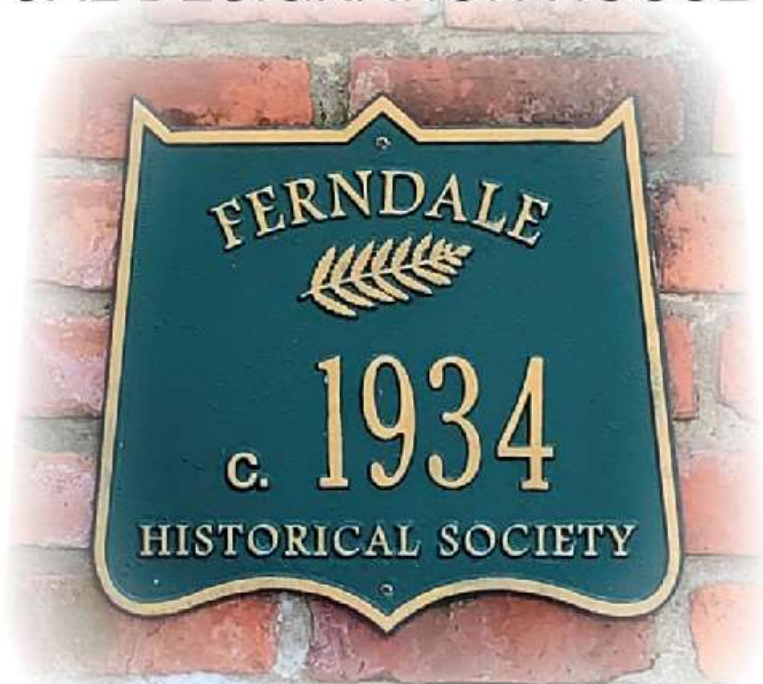
